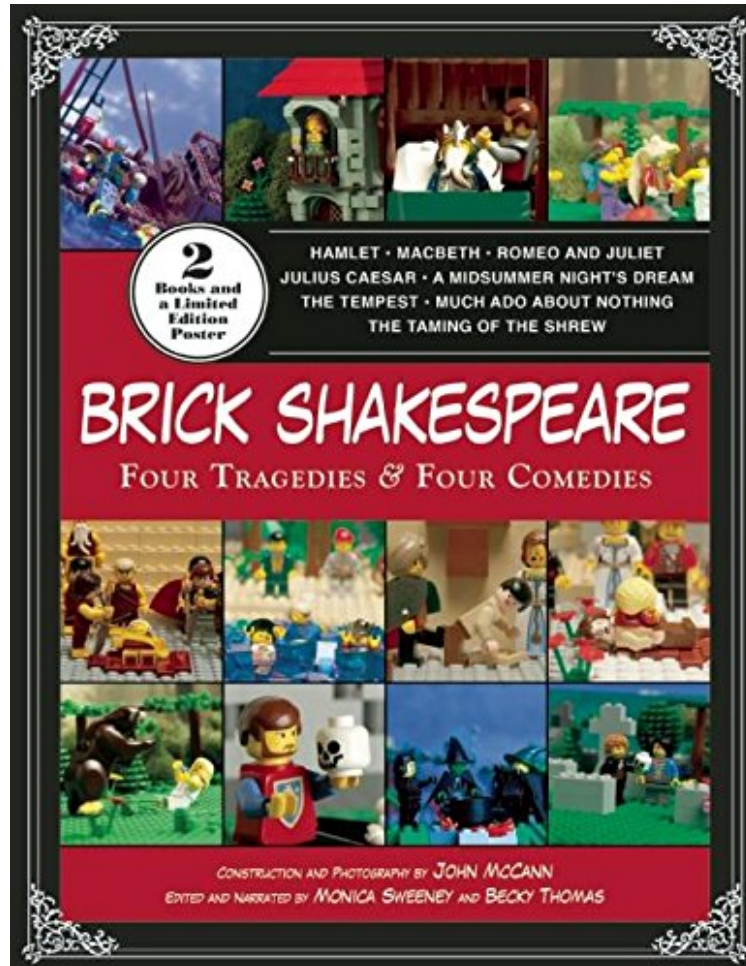

original texts, though, they tend to be very accurate. I know this was a problem for some families who bought the Brick Bible for their children and found it was much more explicit than they expected because it was accurate to the Biblical tellings. The same is true with the Shakespeare stuff. It's not especially gruesome or anything (it's hard to get too gory when the visuals are made of legos) but they're not cutting any corners, either, the stories are what they are.
