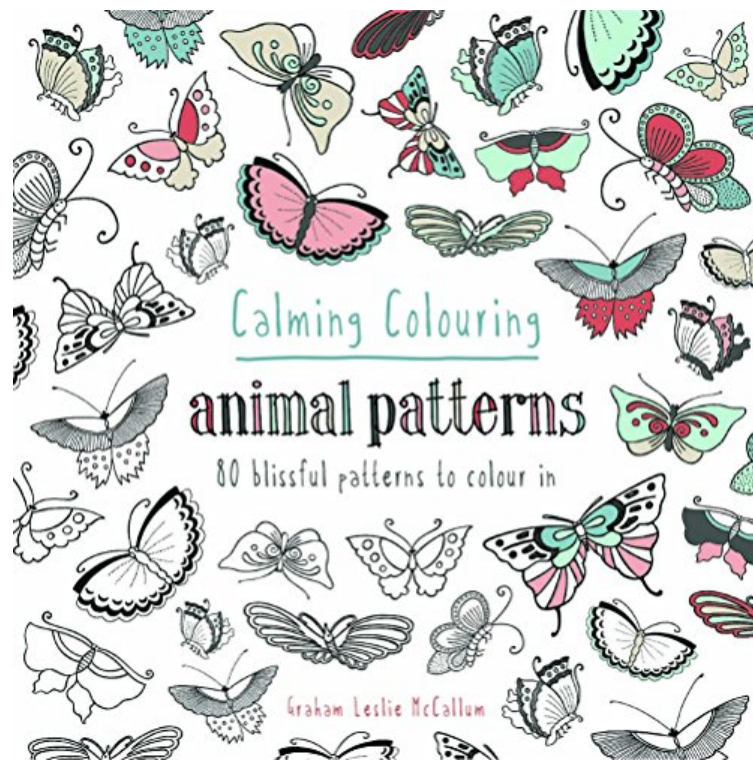

If only all of the interior pages were designed like the coverBy Stoon101This is definitely not my most favourite colouring book. There were no interior views when I purchased it, so I bought it solely based on the cover image. If the content inside had stuck with that same style of a concept (in this case, butterflies) and then provided a number of variations on that theme (note the cover and the way that there are a myriad of different types of butterflies shown flying in different directions), then I would have rated this book much higher. Instead, what we get is a bunch of tediousness. Granted, the title was not at all misleading about it being "patterns." The majority of the images are exactly that...wallpaper. One or two creatures repeated ad nauseum on a page in rows, with some of the rows of patterns repeating right off the edges of the page so that you end up with decapitated birds along the top edge or a tiny fractional tip of bugs wings and antennae along the bottom. You will find pages with a horse going left and the same page with the horse facing right, a black octopus on a white page facing a white octopus on a black page, rows of fish swimming face up next to a page where all of the fish are swimming upside down. Ugh! The butterfly

page was the most beautiful page in the book and I wish that the rest of the book had been designed more like that. Yeah, it would have taken much more effort to draw a variety of unique bugs, birds, fish, etc., than simply hitting "copy," "rotate," and "paste," but the book would have been all the better for it.
