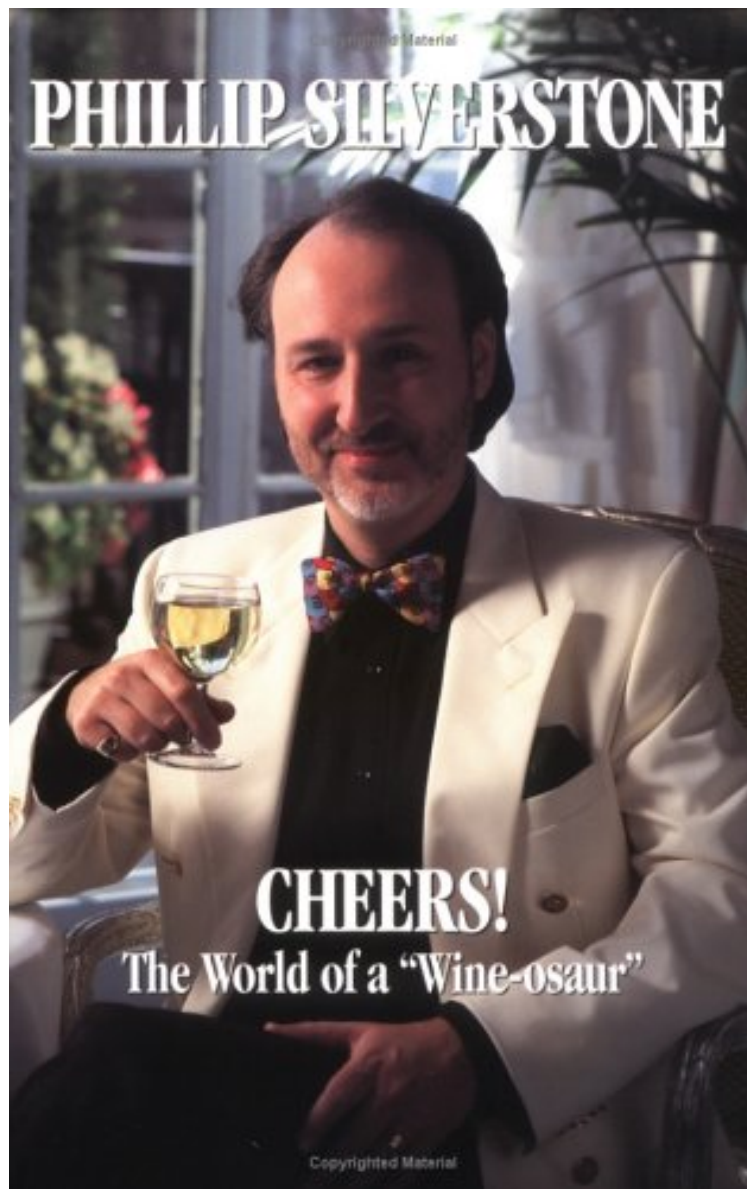


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## **Cheers!: The World of a "Wine-Osaur": Winning Diversions and Anecdotes from Radio and Television's Wine Guy**
