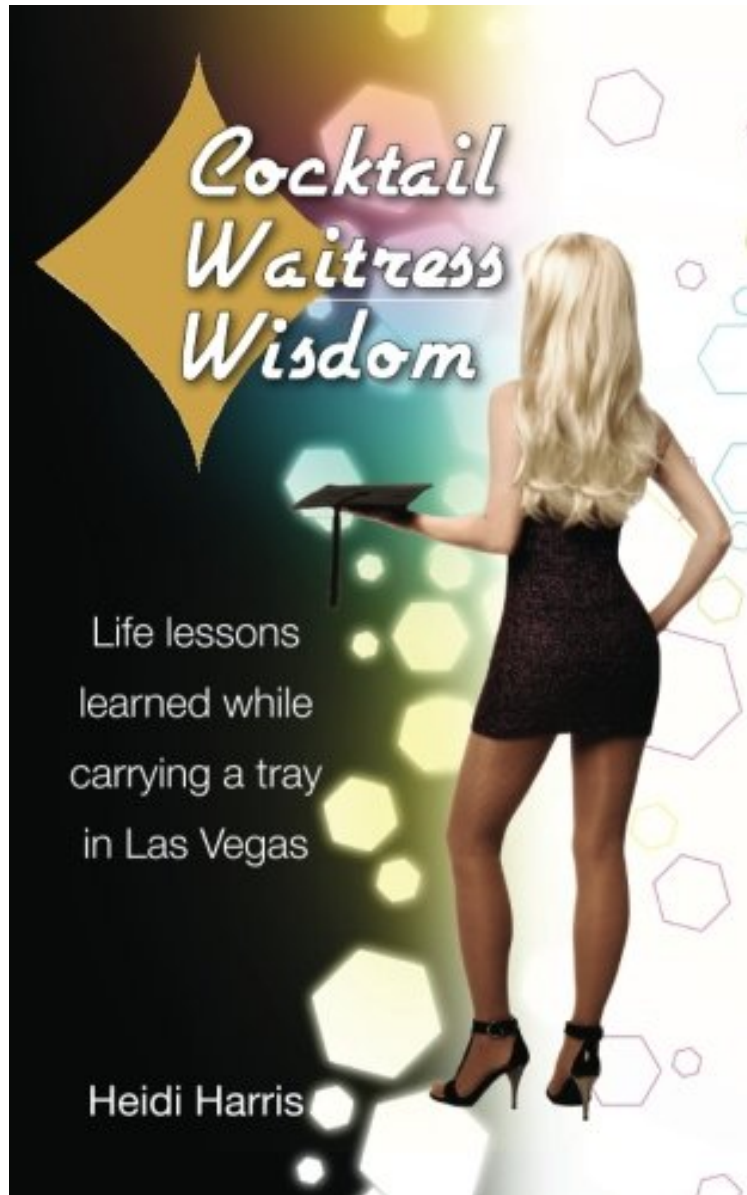

I've written reviews that are longer (which may say something about me!).The print is really big (no need for a special "large-print" version), the margins are generous, and there are a number of blank pages. It's still barely big enough to be bound as a trade paperback, rather than a pamphlet. I didn't even bother reading it when it first arrived, being disappointed at this paltry effort by someone who has an energetic radio style, and is strong in public appearances.So why not a 1 star review?What there is here is really pretty good. It is a little too filtered and truncated, but there is the germ of a good book here. You do get a little insight into the lives of the ladies you see pushing drinks in the casinos.
