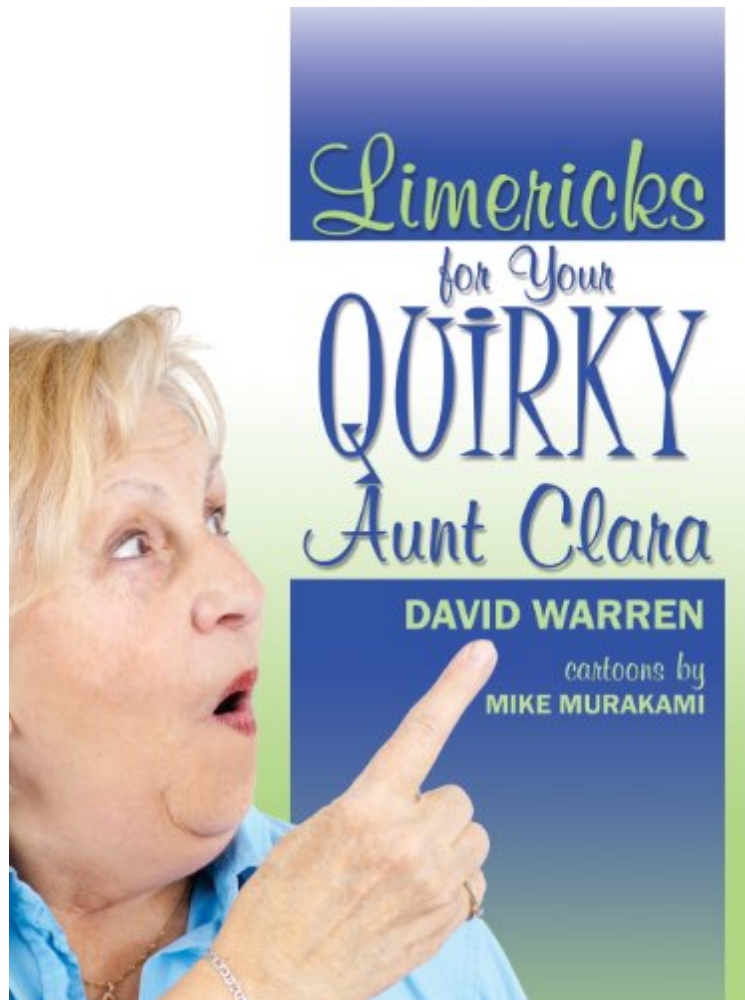

popularized by British humorist Edward Lear, limericks have, for the most part, consisted of ribald or obscene references. As indicated by the title, none such appear here. The humor comes from ridiculous juxtaposition of visual images, outrageous puns, lampooning popular institutions, and anything else that seems funny. The goal is simple: Make 'em laugh.
