Nathan suddenly has gambling money, his dog talks, and he is the first human to see demons and to trash his life without their evil help. He is a special person, but none of them know why. The Lord of Homicides believes he could be the Second Coming of Christ, sent to disrupt a plan to start a chain reaction war to destroy all humans forever. Nathan doesn't have a sober clue.
