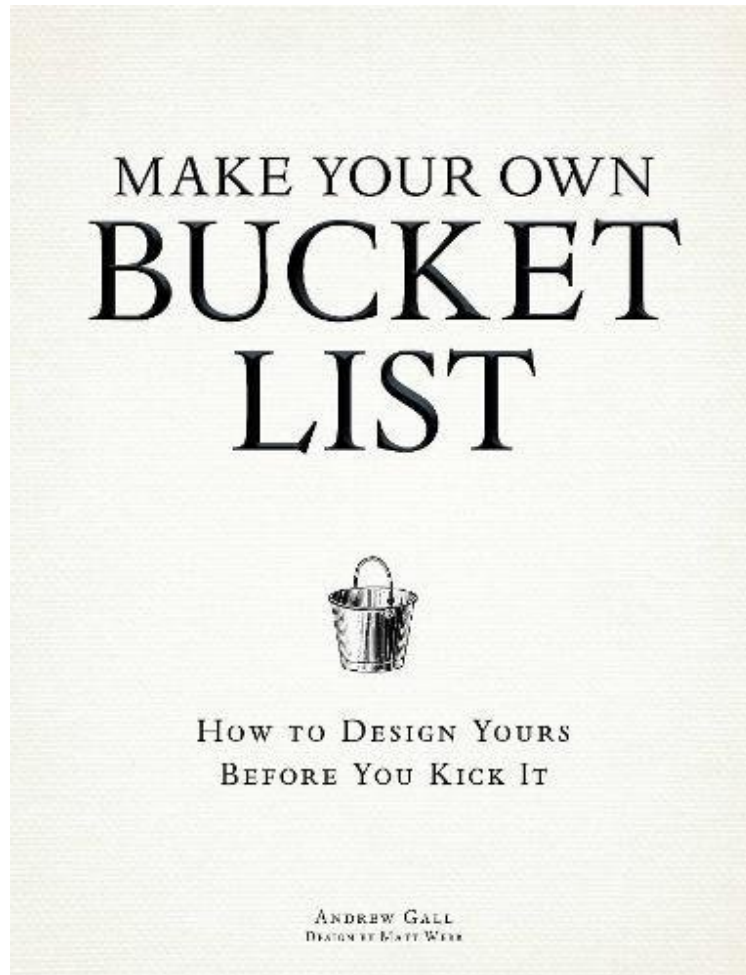


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# Make Your Own Bucket List: How To Design Yours Before You Kick It
