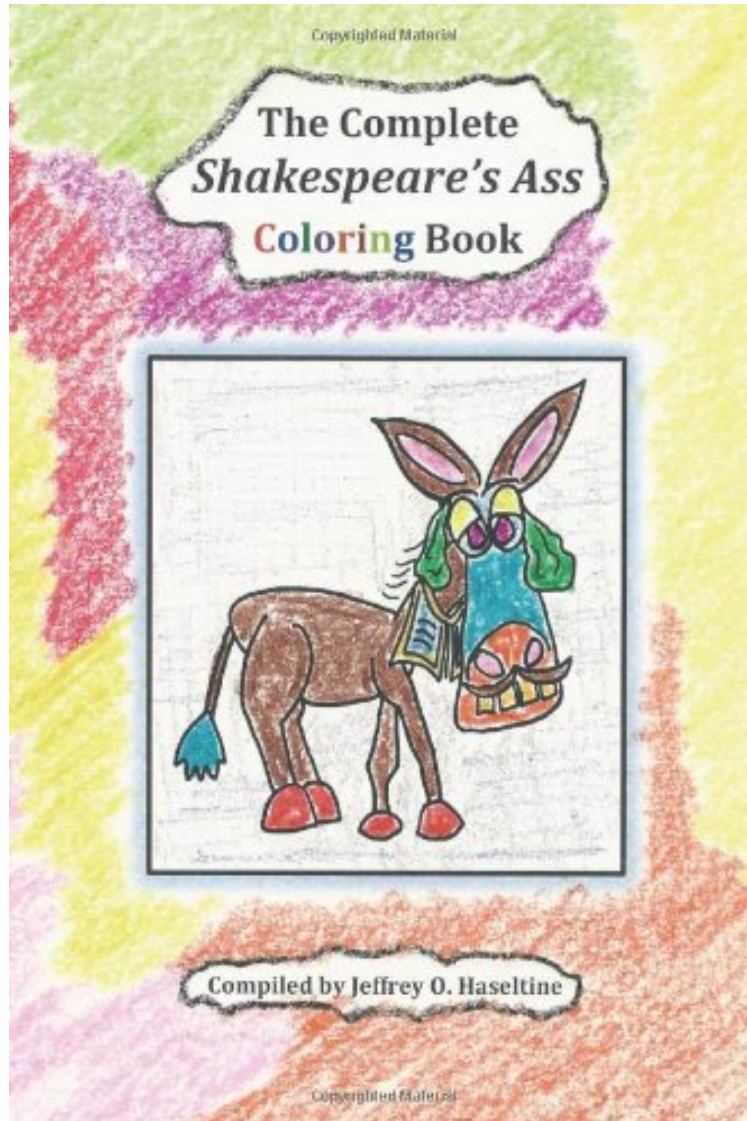

done it again! This time he promotes literacy and high culture in a vein of uniquely Shakespearean lightheartedness. His previous forays into the field were "How to Cheat at Cribbage--With Quotations from William Shakespeare" - a treatise on honesty to those skilled in peeling off layers of literary meaning - and "Shakespeare Quotation Cryptograms -100 Challenging Puzzles to Test Your Decoding Skills and Brush Up Your Shakespeare" - brain teasers for the literati who want to relax from their labors without abandoning the wonderful world of words. Now in this work, the good prof takes a totally different approach. Here is a book you can give to any teenager who is reluctant to tackle his High-school English assignment, confident that it will intrigue the young mind with it's provocative title and thus encourage a positive attitude toward Jacobean letters. At the same time the most straight-laced among us can be confident that we are not adding to the moral decay of our society or corrupting the youth of the nation since the referent in the title is the lowly donkey not the human anatomy. Adults will find it useful too. Since we all make asses of ourselves from time to time, we can color all of the donkeys in the book and then give the book to the offended party. Contrariwise, when a friend has made an ass of him or herself, this book plus a box of crayons would be a pointed yet humorous way to show the offender the error of his or her way. I give the book five stars, one star because the author is my friend - even though he at times deserves his own book plus crayons - three stars for literary style - hey, it's Shakespeare, folks! - and one more star for the ingenious concept of the book. Not being an art critic I will make no comment on the asinine illustrations.

This tongue-in-cheek novelty book is just the gift for everyone in your life who is, in the endearing words of William Shakespeare, "an ass." It includes almost all of the quotations (more than seventy) from Shakespeare's plays in which someone is referred to by that unfortunate epithet, and every quotation is accompanied by the same pathetic, comical drawing of a Shakespearean Ass, suitable for coloring (yes, with crayons--not included) while reflecting on one's need to repent and be less of an . . . well, to be a better person! In addition to its therapeutic value, this book makes a fine accompaniment to a couple of companion volumes: "How to Cheat at Cribbage--With Quotations from William Shakespeare" and "Shakespeare Quotation Cryptograms--100 Challenging Puzzles to Test Your Decoding Skills and Brush Up Your Shakespeare." The world needs more Shakespeare--and fewer asses. This book is designed to help on both fronts.
