From what I understand, this book wasn't approved by Paramount so the writer made it appear to be a parody. The pictures in this book look like one of those Star Trek spoofs in Mad or Cracked magazine. I have a hard time rating anything Star Trek lower than 2 stars. But I was very tempted to give this book 1 star. If you can learn to deal with the ridiculous looking illustrations of Spock smoking a cigarette and Doctor Who looking like Willy Wonka then you also have to adjust to the changes in names and terminology. Here's a list to give you an idea what you're up against: *Kirk is "The Captain" *Spock is "The Scientist" *Dr. McCoy is "The Physician" *Sulu is "Helmsman" *Chekov is "Weapons officer" *Scotty is "Engineer" *Doctor Who is "The Doctor" (Not to be confused with DOCTOR McCoy....but you WILL confuse them I can assure you.) Not utterly terrible so far. But it gets worse: *Vulcans are "Wizards" *Transporters are "Teleporters" *Warp speed is now "Mebious speed" *Mind Melds are "Meeting of the minds" AND....Here's the topper... *Dilithium Crystals are "Ruby Slippers" I had to keep reminding myself what was what as I read. Which made for very distracting reading. The only redeeming point about this book was the conversation between Spock and Doctor Who about humans. As far as continuity, this book takes place towards the end of the original 5 year mission. And this may explain how Kirk learned to ride a horse. (Which he was doing in the Generations movie.) If I were also a Doctor Who fan I might have found this book more interesting. But, as it stands, I would only recommend this one to die-hard Star Trek collectors like me. Otherwise, there are SO many
