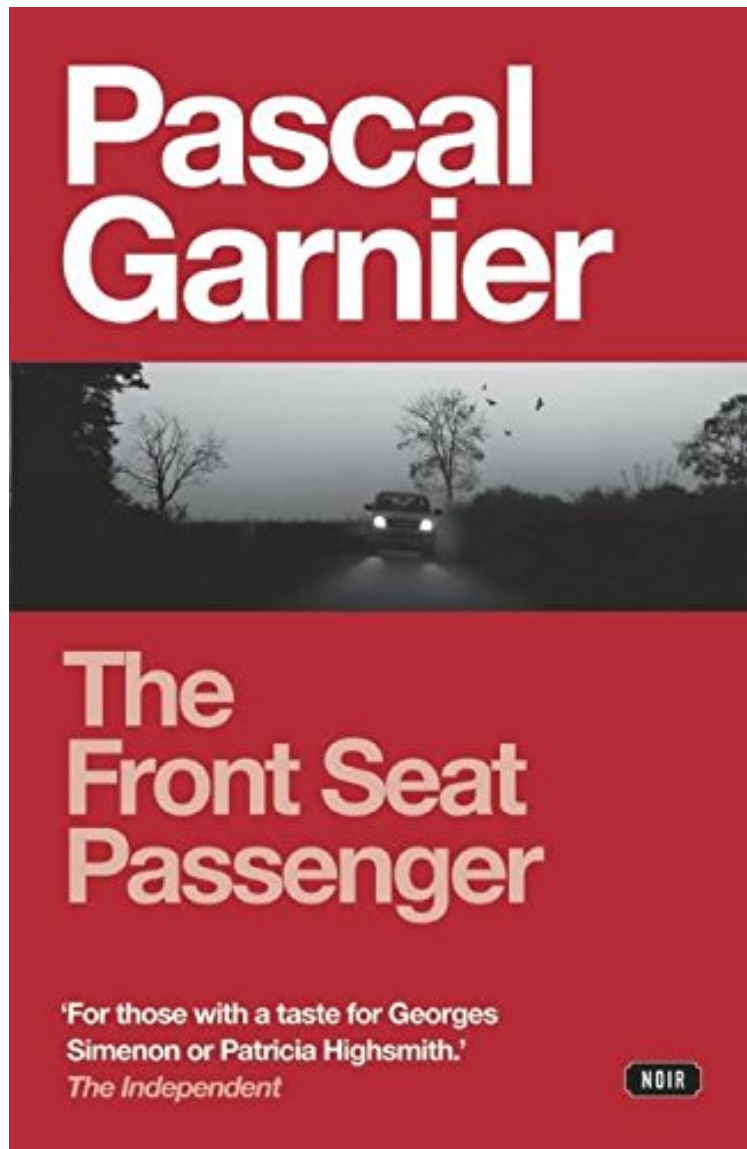

The book tells the story in a matter-of-fact but menacing manner that is quite compelling.
