It centers around three very benevolent ghosts who assume the duties of watching over the family (and their guests) who live in a house where three people have died in days gone by. It's a family story, related by the father and verified through documentation. Since the narrator is an adult, I'd classify the book as for adults. It's high interest with low reading level so that it could be enjoyed by adults learning English as a second language. Kids ages 9-14 would enjoy the story, but they may not like having it related by an adult. Some parents will find the use of an Ouija board and the consulting of a medium to be objectionable. Nevertheless the story is told well, the characters ring true, and the reader will come away with new ideas to ponder insofar as ghosts are concerned.
